

LOOKING AT PATENT SODAS BY GREGG WILSON

A little background on Codd's Marble stoppers:

Hiram Codd (1838-1881) of Barnsley, England was awarded his first US patent on July 23, 1872 and he followed up on April 29, 1873 with the standard design we see today. The earliest versions have a narrow neck, mushroom lip and flat bottom as shown by the George Kiehl / Lancaster, PA bottle on the left, which probably dates to about 1876. It has both patent dates embossed around the base. Some of the early versions are embossed: CODD'S PATENT / PAT APRIL 29th 1873 / SOLE AGENTS / H. CODD & Co / 22 COMMERCE St / NEW YORK


Codd's patent was reissued on August 13, 1878 and those bottles are embossed: CODD'S PATENT / REISSUED AUG 13th 1878 / H. CODD & Co / 23 PARK ROW / NEW YORK

They have the familiar tapered collar, wide neck and slightly rounded base as shown by the D. H. Smith / Yonkers, NY example on the right.

The following embossing can be used to date Codd bottles:

B. Rylands: 1874-1877 Rylands & Codd: 1877-1881 Codd & Rylands: 1881-1884 Dan Rylands: 1884-1888 Dan Rylands Ld: 1888-1897 The Rylands: 1897-1928


"CODD" of Codd & Rylands peened out and replaced with "DAN" indicating this rare transitional bottle was made in early 1884 CODD & RYLANDO





Let's look forward to a great year of digging, learning and sharing information about our great hobby. I almost forgot.....The NATIONAL!!!



BOTTLE BOOK OF THE MONTH

In a "Bloodless Coup" I took over the librarian duties from Fred Cole over the Holidays. In order to generate some interest in the books we have, I'll feature a book each month. For the new year a wonderful book has been added to the WBCA Library! Pete Hendricks donated an example of "Early Glassworks of California" by Warren B. Friedrich. This is the revised (September, 2011) version of his 2010 self-published work and is a superbly researched look at bottles made in California from 1859 to 1899. Friedrich includes photos from the "Pacific Coast" series which are the only known images of those early bottles. Only a limited number of copies of this work have been printed so we feel very fortunate to have a copy.

A Couple of Interesting Puget Sound Finds for December!!!!

This bottle was recently acquired on EBay and is a really great find. At the time of the printing of David Bethman's reference guide <u>The Pioneer Druggist</u>, this bottle was not represented in the Washington State Druggist Bottle section. As that is, we are pleased to bring this bottle to light and share it with our club members!

The South Shore Pharmacy was located as seen on the bottle shows a location at the corner of 59th and Kirkwood streets, and then later according to the 1916 (18th Edition) of the Eras Druggist's Directory was located at 55th and Meridian Aves. David does note in his publication that the South Shore Pharmacy did have a long existence under the ownership of Robert F. Brown from 1904-1906, then under Richard H. Masters from 1906-1920, and then finally under the ownership of Phillip L. Gagnon



from 1920-1922. After that time the name changed to Boswell's Pharmacy, which was then in existence from 1922-1941. If anyone has bottles or other information about this druggist, please let your editor know as it would be great to document!

Another interesting bottle **(below)** fresh from a local Puget Sound dig. We have not been able to find out much about this one, (David B noted it is likely photographic chemical bottle), I was able to find the Gailey Supply Company listed in the State of Washington's Eleventh Biennial Report dated October 1, 1908 to September 30, 1910.





Say Hello to Mabel! (left) Mabel was found around the same site as the Gailey bottle and her survival was remarkable considering she was under a significant amount of earth that had actually crushed a number of bottles around her. Fortunately she was nestled in a layer of sand that may have accounted for her survival in such great shape? Mabel is a larger version of a Hertwig and Co Pet Name China Head Doll that came in various sizes, and was made only for the American market. All that remains is her bisque shoulder head, and she also would have had a cloth body, bisque lower limbs, and painted boots. She dates from somewhere between 1895-1905, and if anyone has seen or knows the whereabouts of the rest of her body, she would like it back!




