

#### **FOHBC RENO 2022 INVITATION**

Here is the antique bottle event you all have been anxiously waiting for. The **Western Region** of the **Federation of Historical Bottle Collectors (FOHBC)** would like to invite you to the **RENO 2022 National Antique Bottle Convention**. The first FOHBC antique bottle convention after the cancellation of the FOHBC 2020 Reno, Nevada and 2021 Syracuse New York conventions due to the Covid-19 pandemic. **Reno 2022** will occur over four days and be a three-day event commencing mid-day on Thursday, July 28th, and ending midday, Sunday July 31st.

On October 15, 1959, Mr. and Mrs. John C. Tibbits (wife Edith) called the first meeting of what became The Antique Bottle Collectors Club of California at their home in Sacramento, California. Tibbits was elected the first president. It was believed to be the first such club. This attracted the attention of antique bottle clubs across the country and many joined what eventually evolved into the **Federation of Historical Bottle Collectors**.

Reno is a city in the northwest section of the state of Nevada, along the Nevada-California border, about 22 miles from Lake Tahoe. Reno has been called "the biggest little city in the world" and is often described as a smaller version of Las Vegas, its much bigger brother to the southeast. Known for its casino and tourism industry, Reno is the county seat and largest city of Washoe County and sits in the High Sierra foothills, in the Truckee River valley, at the eastern side of the Sierra Nevada. The Reno metro area (along with the neighboring city Sparks) occupies a valley colloquially known as the Truckee Meadows, which because of large-scale investments from Greater Seattle and San Francisco Bay Area companies such as Amazon, Tesla, Panasonic, Microsoft, Apple, and Google has become a new major technology center in the United States. The city is named after Civil War Union Major General Jesse L. Reno, who was killed in action during the American Civil War at the Battle of South Mountain, on Fox's Gap. Boasting more than five million visitors a year, Reno offers a wide range of entertainment and educational attractions, many of which are ideal for families. Some of the fun and unique things to do here include hot-air balloon races, bowling tournaments, car shows, and concert performances at the many large resorts here. Reno also makes a great base if you are planning to visit the Lake Tahoe recreational area 45 minutes away, as well as Pyramid Lake to the northeast of the city.



Our convention will be held at the **Grand Sierra Resort (GSR)** (formerly MGM Grand Reno, Bally's Reno and Reno Hilton) which is a hotel and casino located approximately three miles east of Downtown Reno, Nevada. The hotel has 1,990 guest rooms and suites, 12 restaurants, including Charlie Palmer Steak by celebrity chef Charlie Palmer, and a casino with 80,000 sq ft of space. GSR has a movie theater, a Race & Sports Book, nightclubs including LEX Nightclub, a 25,000 sq ft venue with a swimming pool, lake golf driving range, a two-screen cinema, a bowling center, an RV park, and a recently opened ice rink. # SHOOTOUT

This friendly competition will compare and judge three particular types of bottles from anyone who would like to enter examples that they own. The three judging events will be for the 'best' J. F. Cutter star shield type whiskey fifth, Bay City Soda Water Co. bottle and for the Old Sachem's Bitters and Wigwam Tonic. The merits of each bottle will be judged by a panel of veteran collectors experienced with each type. Each bottle entered into the competition will be given a unique code that represents the owner, so the judges will not know the identity of the owner until after final judging. Limit three bottles per category per person.



#### **GROUP 1: BAY CITY SODA WATER BOTTLES**

The Bay City Soda Water Company was formed under the laws of the State of California in December 1870, with stock amounting to \$100,000. It was the first incorporated soda water company in California.

On April 27, 1872, the company trademarked its unique styled bottles to deter imitators. The bottle described in the submitted registration papers is shown here and is a copy of the actual filing. Several mold and color variants are known so it will be very interesting to see what has been found in this family of Bay City soda bottles. With that in mind, this competition will truly be based solely on the aesthetic qualities embodied in each example. Color, condition and other characteristics of the glass will be the merits that will guide the judges to their decision of a first, second and third place winner.

As is nearly always the case with antique bottles, some real surprises may emerge from the submitted entries, and this is what we are hoping to see. We urge anyone who has an example that they think is special, to share it in a grouping that may never be witnessed again.

#### **GROUP 2: J. F. CUTTER FIFTH WHISKEY BOTTLES**

Just as with the Bay City Soda, the second 'shootout' will be with a decidedly western bottle with a similar historical beginning. The J. F. Cutter bourbon bottles were initially documented with a protective trade mark issued by the State of California on April 15, 1870, although the registrant, John F. Cutter, was actually a resident of Louisville, Kentucky when the trade mark was registered. Cutter worked closely with his San Francisco agent, Edward Martin, in attempting to corner the Cutter brand whiskey market.

Much has been written about the brand and legal troubles that entangled it with the J. H. Cutter trade marks. It is safe to state that this whiskey was far more popular than soda water and many more examples and mold variants of the bottle were produced over the next three decades, but they all kept with the general theme of the registered trade mark. Some beautiful examples of this bottle have been found over the years and it will be exciting to see a representative grouping entered into this competition.

#### GROUP 3: OLD SACHEM'S BITTERS AND WIGWAM TONIC

This figural bitters barrel is a favorite among collectors. With a great name, the bottles come in a stunning array of colors. The label stated that it was "From an old Indian recipe in possession of the family of the proprietor for upwards of a century is now offered to the public as one of the most healthy and wholesale beverages extant and as a tonic is unsurpassed. Sold by principal grocers, druggists and hotels throughout the union. Endorsed by a professor at Yale College."

George Goodwin began manufacturing patent medicines in the 1840s at 76 Union in Boston. Around 1850, he and Dr. John O. Langley of Langley's Bitters became partners and in 1854, moved to 99 Union.


By 1857, the firm was named Geo. C. Goodwin & Co., and had taken in William B. Hibbard as a junior partner. Goodwin retired in 1859 and his son Charles C. Langley, and Hibbard ran the business. In 1863, they moved to 38 Hanover. Eventually the company became on of Boston's largest wholesale drug firms. We will see some great examples in this category.





This display is designed to show the best of the best of the Top 25 western whiskey bottles known.

The quintessential bottle that represents our old west is the iconic fifth size whiskey bottle. As the new western frontier developed, the hard driving, hard drinking pioneers often turned to whiskey to lessen the burden of life. As a result, many whiskey dealers marketed their product in what was termed "glass labeled" bottles – that is, appealing bottles blown in molds heavily embossed with lettering and symbols usually reserved only for paper labels. They are generally highly desired by collectors and some were even produced in different colors and crudeness that make them aesthetically pleasing. Others are quite rare as well, which makes them even more precious. The FOHBC is inviting possessors of these rarities to participate in a joint display at the Reno convention in a secure display area on the showroom floor. This display is expected to attract a special grouping of bottles that will easily approach one million dollars in total value. Such a display may never happen again, and with the help of the collecting community, will provide an attraction that, alone, is worth attending the RENO 2022 Convention to witness. Because of the monetary values involved, the display will be guarded with security and other methods not publicized. Nearly everyone who possesses these rarities understands what constitutes bottles considered to be in the 'Top 25'. Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds especially after you have been in a public place, or after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing. Cover coughs and sneezes. Clean high touch surfaces daily. This includes tables, doorknobs, light switches, counter-tops, handles, desks, phones, keyboards, toilets, faucets, and sinks. Be alert for symptoms. Watch for fever, cough, shortness of breath, or other symptoms of COVID-19. Take your temperature if symptoms develop. Follow CDC guidance if symptoms develop.

This event will be catered with late afternoon light fare. **Note:** VIP is defined as dealers, assistants, displayers, early admission, seminar givers, speakers and approved volunteers. Please add this to your agenda!

Convention Packets will be available for pick-up on Friday and Saturday 7:00 am to 5:00 pm at the **GSR Convention Registration Desk 3** adjacent to the **Summit Pavilion**. You may purchase tickets for the FOHBC Banquet based on availability at this time, if you have not done so already.



## Dealer Unloading & Display Set-Up

All dealer tables will be delivered and set up on Wednesday, July 27, 2022. Dealers will be allowed to bring in sales structures and set-up (no merchandise) on Thursday, July 28th from 7:00 am to 5:00 pm, Friday 7:00 am to 5:00 pm (merchandise allowed), and on Saturday, July 30th from 7:00 am to 5:00 pm at the GSR Summit Pavilion. See page 22 for site plan. The showroom will be closed to all participants from Noon to 1:00 pm on Friday before the Ribbon Cutting Ceremony at 12:50 pm. A separate sheet of instructions will be included in your Dealer packet outlining the unloading procedure. Diagrams and maps will be included. There will be strict security at this time. We ask your cooperation during this important time so that the process can move swiftly and safely. Please check the Events Schedule for unloading times. You can place bottles and such on tables at 1:00 pm on Friday.

#### **Ribbon Cutting Ceremony**

Come watch the Ribbon Cutting Ceremony and start of the Reno 2022 National Antique Bottle Convention on Friday, July 29th at 12:50 pm at the **GSR Summit Pavilion**. This event will start promptly 10 minutes before the doors open for dealers and early admission attendees. Most if not all Team Reno Members will be present.

## **Dealer & Early Admission**

Dealers will be permitted to enter the GSR Summit Pavilion showroom floor promptly at 1:00 pm on Friday, July 29th to allow them to arrive at their table spaces before the Early Admission group. Early Admission participants will be allowed in immediately behind the Dealers (approx 1:15 pm). You must wear your **Dealer or Early Admission name tag badge** visibly to gain access to the showroom floor. At 5:00 pm, all Dealers and Early Admission participants must leave the showroom floor and the showroom will be secured and locked. On Saturday, August 2nd, Dealers and Early Admission participants will be allowed on the showroom floor from 7:00 am to 8:00 am. The early admission and general public will follow at 8:00 and 9:00 am.

#### Security

Please note that we expect your cooperation with visibly wearing your name tag badge. #### **Dealer Table Information**

Reservations and table locations will be available on a first received - first served basis. Contract and Information Packets will be available at the FOHBC website on July 24th, 2022. Tables are 8 feet long and 30 inches wide. Table covers will be provided. Every attempt will be made to honor table location requests. Tables will be assigned based upon the date the contract is received. The convention chairpersons will have final say on table assignments. The first 8 foot table will be \$110. Additional tables will be available at a cost of \$100 each. FOHBC members will receive a \$10 discount per contract for the first table only. Up to two name-tag badges per contract will be provided (regardless of the number of tables per contract) with the exception of minor children (under 12 years of age). Please make arrangements for children's name tags in advance. Subletting a table to another dealer or individual is prohibited. At least 75% of your sales table shall be antique bottles, jars, blown glass, insulators, stoneware, marbles, related advertising, and items to assist in the hobby. No flea market type items. All merchandise must be clearly priced. Reproductions, fake labels, repaired, coated, artificially colored, or irradiated glass must be clearly marked as such.

Requests for refunds must be made by July 15, 2022. Refunds for circumstances outside your control, after that time, will be at the discretion of the convention chairpersons. Your contract for sales tables, display reservations, early admission, banquet reservations will be confirmed by email or USPS return mail following receipt of your contract and full payment. Full payment must be sent with your contract. There are no reservations without payment in full. Each dealers and assistant, if applicable, are considered a VIP at the opening day VIP Reception.

#### **Early Admission Information**

Early Admission is available for non-Dealers that would like the privilege of buying early at the show with the dealers. The Early Admission fee will be \$100 for individuals or a family couple (including minor children). This price includes a Souvenir Program and the appropriate name tag badges required for admission to the showroom floor. 


