

FOHBC RENO 2025 INVITATION

The FOHBC National Antique Bottle & Glass Convention is back in the West and back in Reno! It has been a quick three years since 2022, and we are promising a bottle collecting premier event, this time in downtown at a new venue. This year 'Team Reno' will present a superb show with informative Keynote Speaker, Seminars, a grand showroom full of vendors displaying and selling a great variety of bottles and other wares occurring over a fantastic three-day event commencing mid-day on Thursday, July 31st, and ending mid-day, Sunday, August 3rd.

Reno is a city in the northwest section of the state of Nevada, along the Nevada-California border, about 22 miles from Lake Tahoe. Reno has been called "the biggest little city in the world" and is often described as a smaller version of Las Vegas, its much bigger brother to the southeast. Known for its casino and tourism industry, Reno is the county seat and largest city of Washoe County and



sits in the High Sierra foothills, in the Truckee River valley, at the eastern side of the Sierra Nevada. The Reno area (along with neighboring city Sparks), occupies a valley colloquially known as the Truckee Meadows which, because of large-scale investments from Greater Seattle and San Francisco Bay Area companies such as Amazon, Tesla, Panasonic, Microsoft, Apple, and Google, has become a major technology center in the United States. The city is named after Civil War Union Major General Jesse L. Reno,

who was killed in action during the American Civil War at the Battle of South Mountain, on Fox's Gap. Boasting more than five million visitors a year, Reno offers a wide range of entertainment and educational attractions, many of which are ideal for families. Some of the fun and unique things to do here include hot-air balloon races, bowling tournaments, car shows, and concert performances at the many large resorts. Reno also makes a great base if you are planning to visit the Lake Tahoe recreational area 45 minutes away, as well as Pyramid Lake to the northeast of the city.

Our convention will be held at the Silver Legacy Hotel and Casino located in Downtown Reno, Nevada (The Row). The hotel has over 1700 rooms, 42 floors, and is the tallest building in Reno. The Legacy is typically lit green at night and is referred to by many as the "Emerald City" of Reno. It features five in-house restaurants: Ramsay's Kitchen, Ruth's Chris Steakhouse, Café Central, Gordon Ramsay's Fish and Chips, Spa Café and Bar, and six Bars/Lounges as well as a Fitness Center and a Pool. 

The Reno Ballroom

The Reno Ballroom is where the main show will be held. It is located adjacent to the Silver Legacy Resort and Casino on 401 North Center Street (one block from the hotel). The Registration Desk for Dealer and Display check in (Thursday afternoon and Friday morning) will be located in the Pre-Function Salon of the Reno Ballroom Building. Displays will be located inside the Ballroom. We will have 24-hour security available for the length of the Show Friday, Saturday and Sunday.

There will be other events in Reno this same weekend so look online for current road conditions and road closures. Load in and out will be located towards the back of the building. There will be parking for trailers available (parking in Silver Legacy, Circus Circus, and El Dorado parking garages all have height restrictions); there are no height restrictions west of Circus Circus hotel (dirt lot) for oversized Trucks and Trailers. Additional load in and load out information for Dealers/Displayers will be included in the dealer packet.

Based on our last Western Region Show, we expect this year it will be bigger and better than ever. It is important that you reserve your sales table space as soon as possible.

Registration & Ticket Sales

You may obtain your Dealer or Early Admission packet starting at Noon – 4:00 pm on Thursday July 31st, at the **Reno Ballroom Salon**, and during the **FOHBC VIP Reception** 4:30 to 6:30 pm at the **Silver Legacy Resort - Silver Baron Rooms** (C&D). This event will be catered with early evening light fare. **Note:** VIP is defined as dealers, assistants, displayers, early admission, seminar presenters, speakers and approved volunteers. Please add this to your agenda!

Dealer or Early Admission Packets will be available for pick-up on Friday before noon at the **Reno Ballroom Salon** and Saturday 8:00 am to 5:00 pm inside the show at the front desk.

Dealer Unloading & Display Set-Up

All dealer tables will be delivered and set up on Thursday morning, July 30th, 2025. Dealers will be allowed to bring in sales structures and set-up (no merchandise) on Thursday, July 31st from 12:00 to 4:00 pm, and Friday 8:00 to 11:30 am (merchandise allowed under tables), and on Saturday, August 1st from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm at the Reno Ballroom. The showroom will be closed to all participants at 11:30 am on Friday before the Ribbon Cutting Ceremony at 12:00 pm. A separate sheet of instructions will be included in your Dealer Packet outlining the unloading procedures. Diagrams and maps will be included. You must wear your name tag/dealer badge at all times. There will be strict security and we ask your cooperation during this important time so that the process can move swiftly and safely. Please check the Events Schedule for unloading times. You can place bottles and merchandise on tables starting at 12:15 pm on Friday when Dealers will be allowed back in the Ballroom.

Ribbon Cutting Ceremony

Come watch the **Ribbon Cutting Ceremony** and start of the FOHBC Reno 2025 National Antique Bottle & Glass Convention on Friday, August 1st at 12:00 pm at the **Reno Ballroom Pre-function Salon**. This event will start promptly 15 minutes before the doors open for dealers and 30 minutes before early admission. Most, if not all, Team Reno Members will be present.

Display Awards

Display awards will be announced on Sunday, August 3rd. Please **VOTE** for your favorite display! We will have two categories: "**People's Choice**" and "**Most Educational.**" Award ribbons will be presented to the winners on Sunday, at approximately 1:00 pm.

Reno and Nevada Sales Tax and Surcharge Information

A Dealers Permit, and License to Sell is \$20. The fee will be paid to the City of Reno via your registration. The Show Chairman will coordinate this with the state. This surcharge is included in the dealer table cost structure. Each dealer will be responsible for filling out a State of Nevada Tax Form which will be included in the Dealer Packet and it needs to be returned to the front desk by the end of the show.

Security

Please note that we expect your cooperation with visibly wearing your name tag identification badge. We take security seriously and have arranged to have the showroom floor continuously monitored by surveillance equipment and taped. All areas of the display and showroom floor will be monitored continuously by surveillance cameras to ensure security at our event. Furthermore, when the Reno Ballroom is closed for the day on Friday and Saturday, no one under any circumstance, will be allowed back into the room. A full-time security guard will be stationed inside the showroom area during the hours that the show is closed. Again, no one will be admitted to this area during the times when the show floor is closed. Similar security measures will be in place by the Reno 2025 security team for all the events scheduled.

Security measures require that before you unload your sales merchandise, you must pick up your packets as they include your name tag identification badges. Your badges must be worn in the unloading area for obvious security reasons. Please remember that the time of highest vulnerability is during the set-up and break-down times. Even though we have made improvements to our security procedures, your common sense and diligence is your best defense against theft.

Dealer Table Information

Reservations and table locations will be available on a first received – first reserved basis. Contracts and Information Packets will be available at the FOHBC website to download (FOHBC.org). Tables are 8 feet long and 30 inches wide. White plastic table covers will be provided. Every attempt will be made to honor table location requests. Tables will be assigned based upon the date the contract and payment is received. The convention chairpersons will have final say on table assignments. The first 8 foot table will be \$125. Additional tables will be available at a cost of \$105 each. FOHBC members will receive a \$10 discount per contract for the first table only. Up to two name tag badges per contract will be provided (regardless of the number of tables per contract) with the exception of minor children (under 12 years of age). Please make arrangements for children's name tags in advance. Subletting a table to another dealer or individual is prohibited. At least 75% of your sales table shall be antique bottles, jars, blown glass, insulators, stoneware, marbles, related advertising, and items to enhance the hobby. Casino collectables and vintage western memorabilia are also allowed. No flea-market-type items. All merchandise must be clearly priced. Reproductions, fake labels, repaired, coated, artificially colored, or irradiated glass must be clearly marked as such.

Requests for refunds must be made by July 15, 2025. Refunds for circumstances outside your control, after that time, will be at the discretion of the convention chairpersons. Your contract for sales tables, display reservations, early admission, and banquet reservations will be confirmed by email following receipt of your contract and full payment. Full payment must be sent with your contract. There are no reservations without payment in full. Each dealers and assistant, if applicable, are considered a VIP at the opening day VIP Reception.

Early Admission Information

Early Admission is available for non-Dealers who would like the privilege of buying early at the show. The Early Admission fee will be \$100 for individuals or a family couple (including minor children). This price includes a Souvenir Program and the appropriate name tag badges required for admission to the showroom floor. Discounted cost for Early Admission to National Conventions and Shows is another privilege of FOHBC membership. Early Admission is valid for Friday and Saturday. As an exhibitor you are considered a VIP and can attend the VIP Reception from 4:30 to 6:30 pm on Thursday, July 31st at the Silver Baron Rooms C&D – Silver Legacy Resort

General Policies
